





It is certainly true that Ms. Chiquita had a vested interest here, but she presents a verve-filled 1950s selection of banana recipes some of which are, to say the least, unique. I did not see the Banana Waldorf salad coming, nor the banana & salmon entry. The photography also comes from the day when they really knew how to dress a plate for the studio- the banana pineapple salad presentation is, um, just a bit suggestive, though unfortunately there is so much more they could have done when plating the banana & melon-balls... but enough. 
3. Brandt, Johanna. **The Grape Cure.**
*Published in New York by Harmony Centre in
1953, 18th edition.*

Where to begin? On the one hand, the author was a native Afrikaner who claimed to have cured herself of stomach cancer with grapes, and made a lot of money from this very popular book which she promoted using a line of degrees- "N.D." (Doctor of Naturopathy) Ph.N. (Philosopher of Naturopathy) and A.M. (god knows). She was a clairvoyant to boot, writing several prophetic books which boiled down to telling black South Africans to stay in their place. On the other hand, she worked as a spy during the Boer War, sending secret reports on British troop movements from her house in occupied Pretoria, and helped publicize the appalling conditions in British concentration camps which helped public support for the war crater back home in England. So there was a lot going on in her life. But this book is about grapes, and how they'll cure almost anything. Hey, Johanna lived to be 87. Hardcover. 4.75"x7", 191 pages, portrait, dust jacket. Back in the days before “Lunchables” and pre-spread peanut butter, Moms (always the Mom, this was 1940s America) had to figure out what lunch to send to school with little Johnny and Jane each day, lest they get the wrong thing and grow up to be Dexter, or Communists, or something. Thank God this book was available for reference. It also covers sandwiches for the whole family, and points out that the grocery store usually stocks as many as 10 different types of bread, so hey- try something besides Wonder White every once in a while. 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




7. [Conundrum Supper] 1890s Conundrum Supper Menu.

A charming dinner menu for a 'Conundrum Supper', a fad which swept the nation in 1891 and continued in some places until the turn of the century. In a conundrum supper each course is presented as a riddle or pun, often leaving the unwary diner surprised by what appeared on his or her plate. "A Group of Islands", for instance, would be sandwiches, "Backbone of History" were dates, "Staff of Life" would be bread. Some of the items on this menu are especially puzzling- "A Celebrated Actor" may be lost to the mists of time, but a little thought should suffice to deduce what "Embroidered Crustacea" were. Bernstein's Fish Grotto had a unique entrance, a ship's bow (a fanciful, Hollywood-esque re-imagining of Columbus's ship, the Nina), and featured seven dining rooms decorated as ship's cabins. The restaurant was a staple of San Francisco life for decades before and after the Second World War, and was known for its "Coo-Coo Clams from Coo-Coo Cove".

8. [Cool Clams] **1930s Bernstein's Fish Grotto & Coo Coo Clams Clam-Shaped Cookbook.** A charming promotional clam-shaped cookbook by Bernstein's Fish Grotto of San Francisco & Los Angeles. The booklet describes the health benefits of clams in general and Coo Coo Clams (from Puget Sound) in particular, describes the various ways the restaurant will prepare them for you, and then includes recipes for Coo Coo Clams you can buy at the restaurant and take home. 12. [Mineral Water] **1894 New York Invoice for Mineral Water for the Famous Hoffman House Hotel.** An 1894 billhead from Carl H. Schultz, "Mineral Spring Waters" - Carbonic, Seltzer, Vichy", for a large amount of beverages for the Hoffman House Hotel in Manhattan. The Hoffman House was one of New York's most famous and grandest 19th century hotels. Originally built in 1864, by the 1880s the hotel had become world famous for its glamour and opulent decorations as well as its well-heeled clientele. Regular guests included Sarah Bernhardt, Grover Cleveland, Buffalo Bill Cody, John L. Sullivan, General Winfield Scott and others. William-Adolphe Bouguereau's scandalous painting 'Nymphs and Satyr' hung in the bar. Single sheet. 8.5"x9.5", folds, minor soil, light wear. [41373] \$20



13. [Molasses] **How Brer Rabbit Found His Home.** Published in New Orleans by Penick & Ford. No date, but late 1920s or early '30s. Brer Rabbit travels through time and around the world before finally concluding that the very best molasses is available right there at home, canned by Penick and Ford. He then thoughtfully shares 7 pages of recipes. Illustrated with many attractive, though often starkly racist, full-page plates. Softcover. 6"x6", 29 pages, illustrations. 14. [Olive Oil] **1894 New York Billhead from Olive Oil Distributor Societe Hygienique Alimentaire to the Famous Hoffman House Hotel.**

The "Societe" was a distributor of olive and other cooking oils to restaurants and dealers across the country. A Google search of period periodicals indicates that at least some of their "pure" olive oils contained significant amounts of cotton seed oil as well. The Hoffman House was one of New York's most famous and grandest 19th century hotels. Originally built in 1864, by the 1880s the hotel had become world famous for its glamour and opulent decorations as well as its well-heeled clientele. Regular guests included Sarah Bernhardt, Grover Cleveland, Buffalo Bill Cody, John L. Sullivan, General Winfield Scott and others. | 1/2 lb. asparagus, ends trimmed, cut diagonally into 4" strips | 1 cup frozen peas, thawed |
| 1/2 pound mushrooms, thinly sliced | 1/4 lb. prosciutto or cooked ham, chopped |
| 1 medium zucchini, cut into 1/4" rounds | salt and pepper |
| 2 carrots, halved lengthwise, cut diagonally into 1/8" slices | 1 pound fettucine or linguine, cooked and drained |
| | 1 cup freshly grated imported Parmesan |


Heat deep skillet over medium-high heat. Add butter, onion and garlic and saute until onion is softened, about 2 minutes. Mix in asparagus, mushrooms, zucchini and carrots and stir-fry 2 minutes. Increase heat to high. Add cream, stock and basil and allow mixture to boil 3 minutes. Stir in peas and ham and cook 1 minute more. Salt and pepper. In large serving bowl toss pasta, cheese, vegetable mixture and eggs.

Blend 1/4 cup softened butter, 1/2 cup sugar, 1/3 cup flour and 1/2 tsp. cinnamon.

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24. [Wine] **Report on the First German Wine Exhibition at Frankfort on Main. Foreign Office, Miscellaneous Series, 1886. No.9, Reports on Subjects of General and Commercial Interest. Germany.**

A British Foreign Office report on what was apparently the first German Wine Exhibition, held from August 18th to September 12th, 1886. Consul-General Oppenheimer reports that the exhibition, meant to further the public interest in Germany in their domestic wines was only partially successful, due to the fact that many leading producers did not participate, "dissatisfied at the management being left in the hands of hotel proprietors and innkeepers".
